
Prayer Events

The Electoral Roll is the membership list of St Chad's, as set out by the guidelines of the Church of England. We would love for as many members of Chads to be a part of this as possible.

Every six years we have to remove every person on the Roll and prepare a new Electoral Roll before the APCM (Annual Parochial Church Meeting) which this year will take place on Sunday 11th May.

If you have been worshipping with us regularly for six months or more and are 16 or over (or turn 16 in the next 12 months), please do take this opportunity to join the new 2025 Roll. As this a new cycle, if you have been unable to attend church due to illness, you are still able to join the new Roll, you will just need to indicate this option on the form.

We are collecting data online so it is stored securely on our ChurchSuite database.

Mini Chadders

This year has been a year of change. We joyfully celebrated over 35 years of official St. Chad's ministry to young families in Romiley - a truly remarkable milestone! In July, we marked the occasion with a delightful afternoon tea, where we were blessed to reconnect with many of the mums who had attended with their little ones over the years. Some even returned with their grandchildren or children of their own! We are so deeply grateful to everyone who has served faithfully in this ministry across the decades, making such a lasting impact on countless families.

We are a willing and able volunteer team spread across the many sessions, from the Tuesday evening setup crew to the Wednesday morning & afternoon, Friday morning and Saturday morning.

Prammies regularly welcomes 30 - 40 families on Wednesday mornings. The children (aged 0-3+) enjoy free play, while mums and carers can relax over a drink and catch up with one another. Each session includes a craft activity and concludes with a time of togetherness, featuring songs and a Bible story. For special occasions, we've created lovely photo opportunities to help families capture precious memories. Jan Ford, Heather Hills and Adele Youle have taken the lead during in the second half of the year.

Sarah Lawrence has taken Baby Buddies forward and has brought the Snowdrops group under their wing, providing vital support for mums facing postnatal depression (PND). The group is very inclusive and supportive, and great at welcoming new mums. Every week one or other of the mums will comment on what a peaceful and safe space we create and thank us for our care and kindness. Sarah says that 'One of my goals for this group is to create a space where mums feel listened to and heard and in the process feel able to share. This has happened a number of times and resulted in brilliant conversations about where they are in their faith journey'.

Just for Dads Wednesday group continues to build relationships between dads and male carers. It's a small and transient group, with most dads taking a few months' parental leave with their babies before heading back to work. There have been valuable times of connection and conversations about Jesus, seeds scattered that we trust God will water in the coming years. Dave Hill has taken a lead in this season. Additionally, the two **Just for Dads Satur**day sessions have been well attended, with dads and babies at 9.30 then primary aged children with dads, grandads, and others coming together later on to enjoy sausages butties, coffee, craft and fun with Heather and Barry Hills heading the team.

Building friendships and sharing the love of Jesus is at the heart of what we do, and our mum's meal and dad's curry evenings have been a fantastic way to foster connection and community this year. These events have been full of laughter and meaningful conversation along with the informal summer meet ups, which Heather arranged in local parks and have continued the work of building connection and relationships with those attending.

This is a wonderful ministry to our community and one where we show the love of Jesus for many families with young children.

We are still looking to appoint a young families worker and hope to readvertise very soon, so if you can, join us to pray that God will stir the right people to apply and join in with all that He is doing in this space we would relish the role being filled and the ministry taken into the new season.
